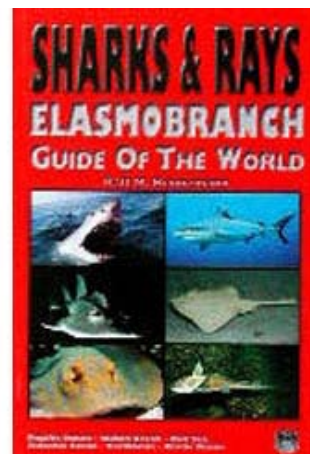


SHARKS AND RAYS ELASMOBRANCH GUIDE OF THE WORLD

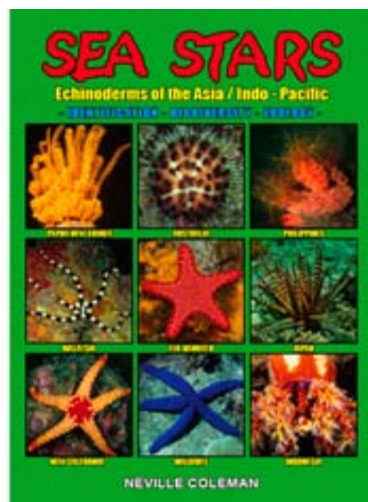
